

It's perfectly nice and quiet on Gerp, until a loud, strange creature arrives bringing even stranger foods...and worse, a taste for adventure. What will Norman do?

Author-artist Bridgette Zou explains, "When I moved to New York, I made myself two promises: the first, to try new things, and the second, to meet new people. Easy...right? Like most things in life, easier said than done. I tell my friends that my life and this book are about facing your fears, encountering unexpected friendships, and being open to the magic of possibilities. Change isn't about the big, grand gestures, but the small, quiet steps. It can happen in New York City or out there in space. But most of all, change comes from you and can take you anywhere."
